On Friday 10th February we will be asking the children to come dressed as a rockstar. Throughout the day we will be taking part in lots of Maths related activities which will also help the children learn their tables.

Parents' Evening

Mrs Marsden has sent details for booking your parents' evening or SENS day slots. We will be offering one slot for each of the children. Separated parents are asked to either come together or take it in turns to attend. We can only offer separate meetings if there is a court order such as a non-molestation order in place.



Attendance & Punctuality

As a school we are required to check our registers on a regular basis. Part of these checks involves looking at persistent absence (where the children's attendance falls below 90%) and the children's punctuality. There are a number of children arriving after 8:55am on a regular basis, sometimes daily. Where we are concerned, parents will receive a letter to invite parents into school to meet with us so we can put a plan together to ensure things improve.



Although the school doesn't officially start until 8:55am, we open our doors at 8:45am to allow the children to come in and complete some early work. We aim to provide the children with a relaxed start to the day where they have the opportunity to speak to their friends, share any news with their class teacher. This ensures they are ready to start learning once we have taken the register at 8:55am.

School Uniform - Thank you!

We have seen a significant improvement - thank you. There are still some children who aren't wearing the correct PE kit. The children should be wearing a white polo skirt, with a black hoodie and either a pair of black shorts, leggings or joggers. The only logos permitted are the school's emblem.



We have some pre-loved uniform in school which can be purchased for a small donation to our PTA. If you are struggling to buy any part of the uniform, including shoes, please let us know and we will be able to help.

Residentials and Trips



To enhance the children's learning experiences we plan a number of trips and a residential for each class over the course of the school year. These are such a valuable part of our curriculum which the children adore. I am conscious that we are asking parents to contribute a significant amount in these difficult times. If you are struggling to pay for any trips or the residential please let us know as we can help. In the past we have asked the School House Church Fund (linked to St Leonard's) and the Up & Under Charity for support, and although they don't have endless pot of money both have been able to provide financial support in the past. We have also put aside part of our budget to help.

Next half term, Sale Sharks will be coming into school to work with the children in Squirrels and Badgers' Class. They will be delivering some tag rugby lessons.



After each PE lesson they will also be delivering some health and well-being lessons which will also be based around rugby.

During the second half of the summer term, Crewe Alex will be coming into school to deliver some football lessons. The coaches will also be working with some children who lack interest in particular subject such as reading, writing or maths. The programme is designed to inspire the children through the power of the Premier League and using the coaches as role models.
