Parish Safeguarding Officer: Vacancy at St Leonard's

The Parish Safeguarding Officer is the key link between the diocese and the parish, concerning safeguarding matters. It is a positive leadership role supporting and providing direction to the parish in good safeguarding practice.

They will have an overview of all church activities involving children, young people and vulnerable adults and will seek to ensure the implementation of safeguarding policy and practice.

The role can be taken by one person, or the role shared. Support is provided by the diocese.

Try Prayer

There are some wonderful prayers around. They have the most beautiful poetic language. They paint the most wonderful pictures with words. Amazing and wonderful as these prayers are, they can leave us somehow feeling like we can't pray because we don't have the right words.

At its essence, prayer is a conversation with God. It is talking to God and listening to him, much as you would with a best friend.



Sometimes with your friends, your conversation flows easily and there is a great sense of joy and fun. Sometimes you walk and talk experiencing something new together. At other times, the situation is such a struggle that just being there with your friends is enough and you don't need words to express the love and support you have for each other.

Prayer is like that too. Sometimes we have so much joy to share with God, so much to tell him that the prayers flow. Other times as we are going about our daily lives, we thank God for a beautiful view, a sunset, or a moment of encouragement. And yet, at other times we just cannot express what is in our hearts because it is too painful or complex to articulate.

The thing about prayer is, we can talk with the creator of the universe about everything. We don't need to have written powerful prose or a stirring speech. We just need to express our heart to Him. We might do this by lighting a candle, by drawing a picture, or just thinking. We can pray alone or with others.

We can tell God anything in prayer. We can express our doubts and worries, our struggles and our success, our fears and our failures. If we want, we can use those great creative prayers of others, or just a simple thank you, sorry or help me.

In his letter to the Philippians Paul encourages us,

“Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” Phil 4:6-7

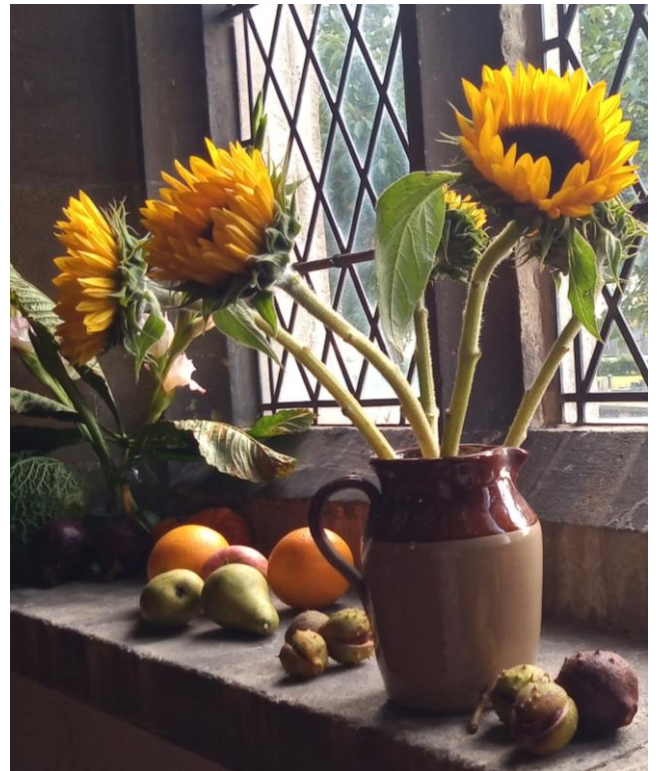

A new kind of Remembrance poppy

For the first time in twenty-eight years, there is a new kind of poppy for Remembrance Sunday this year: it is plastic free.

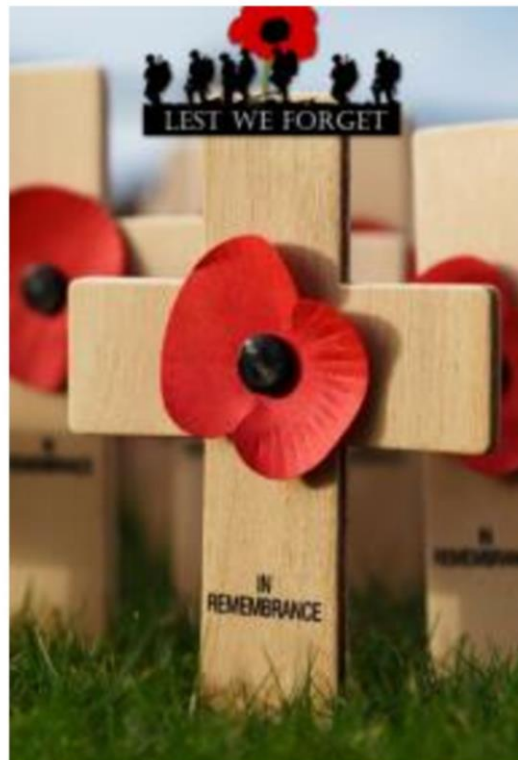
Director of the Poppy Appeal, Andy Taylor-Whyte explains: “We are very proud to introduce the plastic-free poppy. It will not only enable people to support our Armed Forces community but also continues the RBL’s commitment to sustainability.”

The new poppy has been three years in the development and making. The aim was to reduce the use of single-use plastic and to “be economical, sustainable, and less impactful to the environment.”

The new poppy design has a forty percent smaller carbon footprint, and is made from “bespoke red and green paper.” The paper comes from a blend of renewable fibres, fifty per cent of which has been recovered from the waste used in the production of coffee cups.

The plastic-free poppy will be available alongside remaining stocks of the current poppy, to reduce any waste of poppies already produced. Poppies containing single-use plastic can be returned to Sainsbury’s stores for recycling.

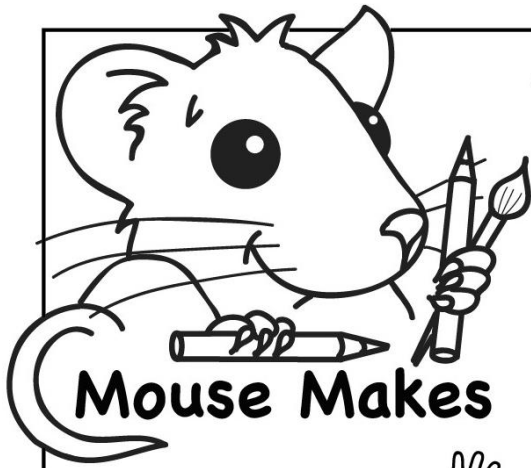
