



Parish Safeguarding Officer: Vacancy at St Leonard's

The Parish Safeguarding Officer is the key link between the diocese and the parish, concerning safeguarding matters. It is a positive leadership role supporting and providing direction to the parish in good safeguarding practice.

They will have an overview of all church activities involving children, young people and vulnerable adults and will seek to ensure the implementation of safeguarding policy and practice.

The role can be taken by one person, or the role shared. Support is provided by the diocese.

Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday - the day when Jesus washed the feet of his disciples. You can read about this in John 13:1-17.

As a concept it is rather alien to our culture but back then washing feet would have been an important part of the welcome into someone's home. What is unusual is that it was Jesus who washed the disciple's feet. Normally this was a role taken by a servant.

This very act of foot washing was accompanied by Jesus telling his disciples that they should serve one another



Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. John 13:14-15

One thing that is really striking about this moment is the fact that Judas was there and Jesus washed his feet even though He knew Judas was going to betray him.

Jesus demonstrates loving without counting the cost. Loving and serving others is a real challenge to us and something that is so difficult to do. Everything in us wants to avoid those who are negative towards us and here in this act of washing Judas's feet, knowing what Judas was about to do, Jesus categorically shows us that there is no limit to the love of God. Something that He demonstrated on the cross the very next day. Good Friday.

Easter demonstrates God's love and shows there is another way to live; serving one another as a reflection of that love.






Walk 'n Talk
