#### **School Communication from September 2024**



From September 2024, we will be changing the way we send communications and moving to online bookings for School Meals and Wraparound care.

We will be sending communications to you via the School Spider App and email. We encourage you to download the School Spider Parent App for instant notifications, please see the guidance attached.

We will continue to use School Money for online payments and will be moving to online bookings for Dinners and Wraparound Care. These will have to be paid for at the time of booking or you will need sufficient credit in top up for childcare vouchers if this is your method of payment.

This will allow sufficient time to bring your accounts up to date or build a credit balance before we begin the new system in September. We will issue further details before the end of July.

#### Sports' Day

This year we will be holding our Sports' Day on **Friday 21**st **June**. The children will be taking part in events throughout the day.



#### **CHAIR'S REPORT**

I have been Chair Since June 2023 and what a year it has been, I have a very good support network behind me and I am happy to stay in this role if everybody agrees.

In terms of members hopefully we will be able to recruit a new secretary as you are aware Helen Glendenning stepped down from this role. We are always looking at recruiting new members and need to try and push this to ease the pressure on others and run small events.

Our fundraisers this year have been the school disco, Christmas Fayre, Film Nights and the wakes. We have done very well at all of these events and thanks to everyone who has put time and effort into making these run smoothly. A big thanks also goes to EDF for helping with supplies and the raffle prizes.

We are now in a position to get a set of the VR headsets and we just need to school to order these. We need a "Wish list" from school to enable us to set achievable targets going forward.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT - 1ST APRIL 2023 to 31ST MARCH 2024

The fundraising achievements for 2023/2024 are to be celebrated. Since being in the position of Treasurer, this fund raising period exceeds previous years by 30%. It is important to recognise the progress which have been made during this financial year, celebrate the income which has been generated and the continued improvements in the operational aspects of the finances. The ability to operate card payments transactions at fund raising events has added flexibility, accessibility and improved fund raising streams.

#### **INCOME**

A grand total of £7,693.63 has been raised since 1 April 2023, a fantastic achievement. The committee team has worked tremendously hard under the expert leadership of our Chair Kelly, with support from the Vice Chair Fabrice and key committee members to achieve this record amount. Each and every member of the committee has contributed and supported the wonderful fundraising events by being creative in many ways to raise funds. The uplift in revenue has been helped significantly by two of our parents' match funding workplace contributions. The school disco generated a grand total of £451 profit. The Christmas fair and raffle was a great success raising £1677, 22% of the total income raised. The 'Break the Rules' day was extremely popular with the children proving to be an excellent income generator adding £310 to the funds. Income from uniform sales has totalled £600 which has been significantly assisted by the purchase of excess uniform stock. Further details of the income and profits raised from events and activities held is contained in the attached breakdown.

#### **EXPENDITURE**

Our total expenditure is £4,316.63. The largest contribution has been towards bus travel and enrichment wow starters. The PTA committee has also been working hard to raise funds for the purchase of VR headsets. The committee has raised sufficient funds to purchase half of the planned headsets as part of a phased roll out over a two-year fund raising period. It is a fantastic outcome the committee are in a secure financial position to purchase the first phase of the VR equipment. Our challenge during the next financial year will be to ensure the momentum in the fundraising plans is maintained to complete phase two of our VR equipment purchase.




