Car Parking

School drop-off and pick-up time are always difficult with everyone trying to find a place to park at the same time.

It's important that people park responsibly to ensure the safety of pedestrians and other road users. Yesterday, I asked our PCSO to come into school as I was aware that some parents are not parking safely. I know that she spoke to a few parents about their parking before asking them to move.

When using our carpark, can you please ensure that you park considerably:

- Speed limit 5mph
- Park along either edge
- Reverse into your 'space' so you can see pedestrians clearly as you drive out
- Don't leave too bigger gaps between cars

When parking on the road, please leave plenty of room either side of the zig zag lines. It's important that families can cross safely, and they won't be able to do this if their view is blocked by parked cars. The zig zag lines are there to keep children safe and should not be parked on during school hours.

We allow 15 minutes at the start of the day (8:30 to 8:45am), and 10 minutes (3:05 to 3:15pm) at the end of day for you to drop-off and pick up your child. Please try to stagger when you arrive, this will really help ease the congestion. It's also important that you leave as quickly as possible once you have dropped your child off or picked them up. Again, this will free up spaces in our carpark.

We're also in the process of renewing the lease for the field and carpark. As part of these discussions we are trying to get the land owners to improve the surface of both. Our hands are currently tied, as the lease states that we cannot make any permanent changes to the land, hence the gravel and poor drainage.

I have also spoken to Cheshire East Highways, and someone from the traffic team is going to come out to school to see what other measures they can put in place. I will keep chasing this until they come out.

School Communication from September 2024

From September 2024, we will be changing the way we send communications and moving to online bookings for School Meals and Wraparound care.



We will be sending communications to you via the School Spider App and email. We encourage you to download the School Spider Parent App for instant notifications, please see the guidance attached.

We will continue to use School Money for online payments and will be moving to online bookings for Dinners and Wraparound Care. These will have to be paid for at the time of booking or you will need sufficient credit in top up for childcare vouchers if this is your method of payment.

This will allow sufficient time to bring your accounts up to date or build a credit balance before we begin the new system in September. We will issue further details before the end of July.

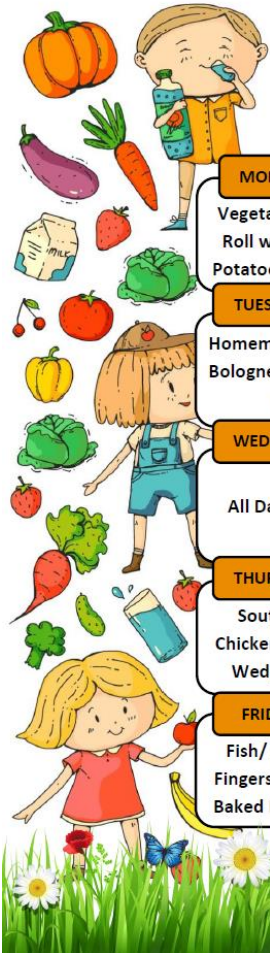
