

A Puzzle with thanks to David Hulse

A vicar wishes to meet the parishioners in small groups and calls for them to attend a meeting in the village hall where they can get to know each other.

8 people attend the first meeting-so with the vicar there is a total of 9.

It is suggested that people sit in groups of three at three tables in four sessions, sitting with two new people in each session.

After the four sessions the vicar has met each parishioner once and each parishioner has met all 7 others once only. i.e. nobody meets anybody twice.

Draw a seating plan for each table at each session. i.e. for ABCDEFGHV (V for vicar!?)

At the next meeting 15 new parishioners arrive making 16 in total.

Draw a seating plan for four tables of four in five sessions such that again everyone meets everyone once only.

note: solutions to puzzles of this kind are possible when the total number of participants $N=A \times B$ and when $(N-1)=C \times D$ where A, B, C and D are whole numbers.

e.g. $N=9=3 \times 3$ and $(N-1)=8=4 \times 2$ $N=16=4 \times 4$ and $(N-1)=15=5 \times 3$

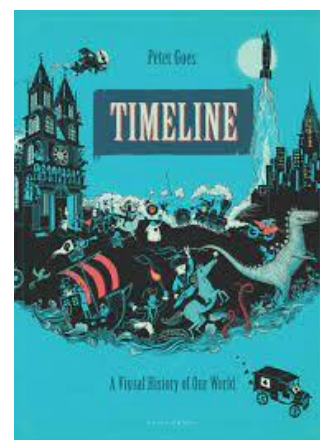
There will be many solutions so not everyone will get the same result. The plan for the first meeting is easy to do but the plan for the second meeting is much more difficult.

News from Warmingham CE Primary

This term our study themes are based around the book 'Timeline'. Each class will be learning about a different period of history.

Otters (Reception)

Otters Class will be using the topic 'It's good to be me' for the first part of the half term. They will be learning all about themselves, what is important to them and how to stay healthy. They will talk about their families, who lives with them and significant people in their lives such as grandparents and other family members, and how all families can be different in many ways. They will also find out 'what is a family tree?' Alongside this they will be making new friends, learning new routines and celebrating everyone as being unique and talking about why we are all special and what their aims and goals are for this year.



Hedgehogs (Year 1 and Year2)

Hedgehogs Class began their new Study Theme with the help of a strange looking box. During the holidays Mrs B found a time capsule in our school grounds.

This has generated many questions:
What are these objects?





What were they used for?

And most importantly - which time period are they from?

The children are looking forward to finding out more about the artefacts. Last week they travelled back in time to meet a Victorian lady and discovered more about what life was really like during Victorian times.

Squirrels (Year 3 and Year 4)

This term in Squirrels, we will be travelling back in time to discover what life was like in Ancient Rome. They will learn all about the Roman Empire including the impressive Roman Army and the key Emperors and Invasions. Later on in the term they will look at how the Romans have impacted our life today and how they still live on in Britain.



They will be using supporting texts linked to our study theme to support our learning and the children will be able to get creative and artistic when we look at Roman Art and Infrastructure.

Last week the children spent the day being archaeologists and discovered Roman coins buried in the school grounds. They then explored their artefacts and created an observation sheet about our findings. The children then produced their own coin using clay modelling.

They will be studying the history of the local area, including: local case studies; Iron Age artefacts found locally; Roman salt mining in Warmingham and Middlewich; the introduction and use of the Canals during the Victorian Era and the impact of World War II on the village. They will also explore how the pandemic will be viewed as a historical event (that the children can provide first-hand accounts of) and we will discuss upcoming changes to our area such as HS2.

Dungeons and Dragons club started last Tuesday night, and the adventurers created their characters for the upcoming quest. They also made some fantastic Dragon Eye art.


