

Warmingham Wombles

Warmingham Wombles is the names for our before and after school provision where we offer a termtime wraparound care in a safe, secure, warm & welcoming environment, giving parent additional support outside of the school day.

We aim to provide a high-quality service for the parent of those children who attend Warmingham. You will have peace of mind knowing that your child is in good hands & being well looked after by our caring staff. All staff members are fully trained in safeguarding, paediatric first aid & food hygiene, and also have a full & current DBS check. Although the provision is not part of the school day, it still follows all of our policy and procedures and is subject to the same monitoring and expectations as the rest of the school.

Both the breakfast & after school clubs are well resourced, providing a wide range of fun, stimulating & creative activities that are suitable for all ages & interests. The children also have the opportunity to play & explore in our school grounds to expel some energy before the school day starts and again at the end of their busy school day.

Breakfast Club - Priced at £6

7.30am to the beginning of the school day.

A variety of breakfast cereal, fresh fruit & milk are provided for the children to choose. Breakfast is served up to 8am

After School Club – two sessions available.

The session starts with a drink and snack before the fun starts. The children are then able to choose from a range of fun activities whilst they play with the other children.

Session 1: 3.15pm to 4.15pm: Priced at £6 (includes a snack and drink at the end of the school day) Session 2: 3.15pm to 6.00pm: Priced at £12 (includes a light tea which served between 4:45pm and 5pm)
