

### A Plea for Support from the PTA

Over the years, many of you have attended events hosted by the PTA here at Warmingham C of E Primary School. We hope you have enjoyed the variety of activities and events we've organised for you and your children.

What you may not realise, however, is the amount of time, effort, and planning that goes into each event. Additionally, the PTA's contributions are vital to ensuring that important aspects of the school year are funded.

For example, did you know that the PTA funds the coaches for the KS1 and KS2 residential trips each year? In 2025, the cost for this will be around £1,400. Without the PTA's support, the cost to each family would increase by approximately £20.

The PTA also covers the cost of the Year 6 Prom, trip and Autograph Books, which provide lasting memories for our children as they move on to secondary school. We also fund the WOW Starters every year, which are an important part of the children's education.

### So, why are we telling you this?

Unfortunately, the PTA is currently struggling to find enough volunteers to support these events. As a result, a small group of parents are shouldering the responsibility for all events, which is becoming increasingly difficult and stressful. Many volunteers are taking time off work to help organize or run events.

Not only does this place a great deal of stress on the few volunteers, but it also means that we, as parents, miss out on enjoying the events with our own children. This is something our children are also starting to feel, as they are missing the opportunity to have us involved in the events that are so important to them.

Without additional support, the PTA may not be able to organise future events, which would mean a loss of funding for the school. This would lead to increased costs for school trips, no more Santa gifts at Christmas, no Year 6 Prom, and no Leavers' Gifts, among other things. At the moment, we are also unsure if we'll be able to run the stalls at the Warmingham Wakes.

We are reaching out to ask for your help. We don't expect any one volunteer to help at every event or to commit to an entire event. If enough parents volunteer, we can organise shifts for stalls/events allowing you to still enjoy the events with your families.


