Dear Parents,

I will inform you via email of any changes as they occur. As yet, we haven't made a decision about whether our parents' evening will be held remotely or in person. We are hoping to invite you into school but this will depend on the number of COVID cases in school.

Miss Rauer will be leaving us at the end of this term. She is moving nearer her family, which means that the distance to work will be too far. This isn't a decision she has made lightly. I know that the children are going to miss her greatly, but I'm sure you'll appreciate that it wasn't an easy decision for her. After half term, she will be reducing her days to three: Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. I will be with the children on a Thursday and Friday. Earlier this week, we appointed Laura Wright, an experienced teacher. She lives locally and is excited about joining our Warmingham team. Although, Miss Rauer hasn't been with us for very long, she has become an important part of our team. She will be greatly missed by the children and staff.

#### COVID Update

As we look to the start of the next half term, I am hopeful that we can once again begin to remove some more of the current restrictions we have in place. After half term, the following measure will be in place:

- There will no longer be timetabled staggered toilet breaks.
- Children will predominantly continue to be taught within their class bubbles although there may be mixing for planned activities such as World Book Day.
- We will continue with our current drop off and pick up routines.
- We are hoping to invite parents into school for parents' evening.
- Worship will continue to be held in the village hall.
- If numbers continue to drop we will be able to invite parents to share our celebration worships with us.
- PE will take place in the village hall and outside depending on the activity.
- Staff may choose to wear masks in communal areas within school.
- Parents do not need to wear masks when entering the school site.
- Staff will continue to complete an LFD test twice weekly: Sunday and Wednesday evening
- Common touch points will continue to be cleaned more regularly.
- Children will continue to sanitise their hands as they enter school.
- Good hand and respiratory hygiene will be encouraged. We have purchased some glitter liquid soap – we will be using this after half term to ensure the children are washing their hands thoroughly.

Currently, Cheshire East Public Health Consultants have recommended that all children who attend schools and colleges are asked to take an LFD test before they return to school after the half term break and that if they are positive they should not attend. *They should also stay away from school or college and book a PCR test if they have any symptoms.* Staff will also test before returning and continue regular testing during the rest of the term. Should there be any further changes to the testing programme following any DfE and government announcements, I will update you before the return to school on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> February.

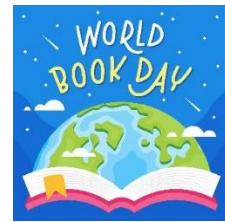

In Cheshire East, the number of cases are reducing but remain very high, therefore it is very important that we continue to do all we can to protect ourselves and others.

### Red Nose Day

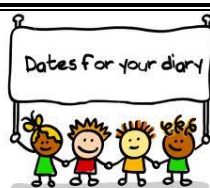
Red Nose Day is on **Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March**. The children will be able to wear something red or some of the merchandise in exchange for a donation.

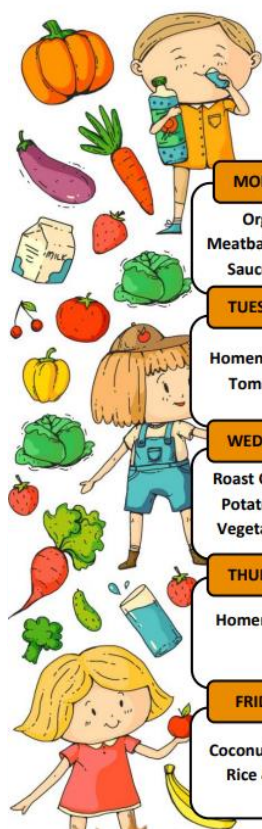
